QUESTION NO: 2

ANSWER: A D

Explanation:

"Save a copy of the rule and change the condition. Deactivate and delete the original rule." is a complete solution because a copied business rule can be edited to remove the fax field from the validation logic and then used as the replacement rule. Retiring the prior rule prevents two versions of the requirement from being applied to Contact records. This approach is especially useful when the existing rule should be preserved temporarily as a reference or rollback point while the revised rule is validated.

“Change the condition and activate the change.” is also a complete solution because business rules use conditions to evaluate field values and apply the required validation behavior. Updating the condition so that it evaluates telephone number or email, rather than telephone number, fax number, or email, implements the revised policy. Activating the updated rule publishes it for use in the applicable model-driven app and ensures the changed logic is enforced for users creating Contact records.

The Power Apps app can then access this connected data through the same secure platform, rather than maintaining isolated data structures for each system. Dataverse also supplies role-based security, business logic support, APIs, and integration capabilities that help ensure the data is consistently available across Power Platform and Dynamics 365 workloads. This makes it the appropriate component for linking sales information with customer and product data in the described solution. Production resources and data can therefore remain protected from work performed in development and test.

Microsoft recommends using separate environments as a core Power Platform ALM practice, with a dedicated production environment and one or more nonproduction environments for development and testing. Power Platform environments are organizational and security boundaries for resources such as apps, flows, connections, and Dataverse databases. An environment can be created without a Dataverse database, so the first statement is correctly marked No. Microsoft explains that a database can be added when it is needed, rather than being an unavoidable component of every environment. These model types support practical business scenarios without requiring makers to build or deploy machine-learning infrastructure themselves. Generating a canvas app from a Microsoft SharePoint list creates a working, data-connected application based on the list structure. The generated app includes a browse experience that displays records from the SharePoint list in a browsable gallery. Users can scroll through the available list items and select an item to view its details. This fulfills the requirement for a screen containing a browsable list of SharePoint list items.

The generated app also includes an editing experience connected to the same SharePoint list. From the browse and detail experiences, a user can open a form that is configured for the list's fields and save changes back to SharePoint. This allows

users to update existing list items, and the standard generated app design also supports creating new items where the user has appropriate permissions. The form and its save behavior are automatically wired to the SharePoint data source, so the app provides an editable interface without requiring the maker to build the screens manually.

Authentication can be configured to match the service, such as API key, basic authentication, OAuth, or Microsoft Entra ID where supported. The app maker can then add the custom connector to the app and call its actions like other Power Platform connectors. This approach supports the required integration while keeping connectivity managed and reusable rather than embedding direct service-call logic throughout the application.
