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QUESTION NO: 1

For federal clients, FIPS 140-2 and AES 256-bit encryption are applied to which three areas? (Choose three.)

ANSWER: A D E

Explanation:

For federal client deployments, the applicable protection model covers data throughout its lifecycle: data in use, data in rest, and data in transit. Data in use refers to information being actively processed by the Workspace ONE platform or its managed services. Protecting this state supports the requirement to use validated cryptographic capabilities wherever sensitive federal data is handled. Data in rest covers persisted information, such as records and stored content, and AES 256-bit encryption provides strong encryption for that stored data. Data in transit covers information moving between endpoints, Workspace ONE services, and integrated components; protected transport sessions prevent disclosure or alteration while the data crosses a network.

FIPS 140-2 is a U.S. federal cryptographic-module validation standard, while AES is an approved encryption algorithm used to protect sensitive information. Together, these controls address active processing, storage, and communications rather than limiting encryption solely to a single storage or network layer. VMware's Workspace ONE security material describes encryption and secure communications as core platform protections, and the NIST FIPS standard defines the validation requirements for cryptographic modules used by federal agencies. ANSWER: B

Explanation:

VMware Workspace ONE Access Connector is required because it provides the on-premises connector services that allow a SaaS Workspace ONE Access tenant to securely use enterprise resources that remain inside the organization's network. Its Directory Sync service connects to Active Directory and synchronizes users and groups into Workspace ONE Access. The connector's authentication-related services support enterprise authentication flows, including Kerberos-based authentication and integration with authentication methods such as RADIUS and RSA SecurID where configured. The Virtual App service is also used to integrate entitled virtual desktops and published applications from supported providers, including Horizon environments and Citrix, so they can be presented through the Workspace ONE catalog. These services use outbound

communication to the SaaS tenant, avoiding a requirement to expose the internal directory, authentication infrastructure, or virtual-app resources directly to the internet. VMware documents that the Access Connector is deployed on-premises for directory synchronization, user authentication, Kerberos authentication, and virtual-app collection functions in Workspace ONE Access SaaS deployments. Explanation:

Workspace ONE Intelligence Connector must be installed on its own server. The connector is an on-premises Workspace ONE UEM component that securely transmits Workspace ONE UEM data to the Workspace ONE Intelligence cloud service for reporting, dashboards, automation, and insights. VMware's documented deployment requirements specify that the Intelligence Connector service is installed on a dedicated server rather than being co-located with core Workspace ONE UEM roles. A dedicated host helps isolate the connector workload, avoids resource contention with UEM services, and supports the intended network and security architecture for outbound communication with Workspace ONE Intelligence. During planning, administrators should also ensure that the dedicated server meets the applicable operating-system, .NET, connectivity, certificate, service-account, and firewall requirements published for the connector release. This installation placement requirement applies specifically to the Intelligence Connector service and is part of preparing a supported on-premises UEM integration with Intelligence. Explanation:

Workspace ONE UEM compliance policies evaluate reported device conditions and can apply remediation actions when a device does not meet the organization's requirements. **Compromised status** can be evaluated to identify rooted Android devices or jailbroken iOS devices. **Encryption status** can be evaluated to ensure that device storage is protected. **Operating system version** can be evaluated to identify devices that are running an unsupported or outdated OS release.

When a device violates a configured compliance rule, Workspace ONE UEM can take actions such as notifying the user, sending an email to an administrator, blocking access, or removing managed enterprise data according to the configured policy.

Workspace ONE UEM uses the native push-notification infrastructure provided by each device platform to notify managed devices that they should contact the UEM service and retrieve pending commands or updates. Apple devices use Apple Push Notification service, commonly called APNS. This is the Apple-operated service that enables Workspace ONE UEM to send a lightweight notification to an enrolled iOS device when an administrative action is waiting. VMware's documentation describes APNS configuration as a required part of Apple device management: [VMware Workspace ONE UEM APNS overview](#).

Windows devices use Windows Notification Service, abbreviated WNS. This Microsoft service is the platform notification channel used to wake or notify supported Windows devices, enabling them to receive and process management activity from Workspace ONE UEM. Android devices use Firebase Cloud Messaging, abbreviated FCM, which is Google's messaging service for delivering notifications to Android applications and devices. Google documents FCM as its cross-platform messaging solution at [Firebase Cloud Messaging documentation](#). Thus, the correct completed relationship is iOS with APNS, Windows with WNS, and Android with FCM. The placements shown in the answered image match these platform-specific third-party messaging services exactly.

QUESTION NO: 6

Which three are features of the Workspace ONE Content Gateway service? (Choose three.)

Explanation:

Workspace ONE Content Gateway is an edge service that securely brokers managed-device access to enterprise content repositories without exposing those repositories directly to the internet. **Secure access to internal repositories.** is a core purpose of the service: requests from authorized Workspace ONE users and devices are proxied to content sources located on the corporate network. **Support for most corporate file servers.** is also a key capability because Content Gateway integrates Workspace ONE Content with common enterprise repository types, allowing organizations to make existing corporate content available through a controlled mobile-access path. **Provides health status on external repositories.** is correct because the service and its repository connections can be monitored, enabling administrators to identify the operational state of configured repository access and maintain service availability. These capabilities make Content Gateway suitable for publishing internal corporate content securely while retaining centralized management and visibility in the Workspace ONE environment. VMware's Unified Access Gateway operational guidance describes Content Gateway as an edge service used to provide secure access to internal content resources; see [VMware Tech Zone: Configuring Edge Services](#). Direct is VMware's recommended email deployment model for an Office 365 scenario because Office 365 is a cloud-hosted service that mobile devices can reach directly over the internet. In the direct model, Workspace ONE UEM deploys the appropriate email configuration to enrolled devices, and the mail client establishes its connection directly with the organization's Office 365 or Exchange Online tenant. This design is well suited to cloud email because it avoids placing an on-premises email gateway in the mail-flow path solely to reach a service that is already internet-accessible. Administrators can use Workspace ONE UEM profiles and application configuration to consistently provide account, server, authentication, and security settings to managed devices while Microsoft 365 handles the hosted email service. The approach also reduces infrastructure complexity and aligns with the operational model of Exchange Online. VMware's Workspace ONE UEM documentation describes the available email deployment approaches and their use with cloud-hosted email, while Microsoft documents Exchange Online as part of its Microsoft 365 cloud service. Freestyle Orchestrator evaluates the status of each resource before processing the next item in the workflow. This enables administrators to create a controlled deployment sequence, such as installing a prerequisite application before deploying a dependent application or applying a configuration profile after a required application is present. Standard independent assignments do not provide the same workflow-based sequencing capability.
